

LANDSCAPE THOUGHT QUESTIONS

There are many things to consider when approaching a new landscape project. Your landscape is an extension of your home and we want you to feel as comfortable when you are enjoying your “room” outside as you do when you are inside. The information you provide here will help us create a landscape that fits your needs and gives you the joy and serenity you deserve. All parties involved in this project should participate in thinking through these questions.

- What are your long term/short term plans for your property?
 - Pool?
 - Addition/renovation?
 - Change in driveway pattern?
 - Installing a shed or other structure?
- Do you plan on entertaining guests outdoors?
 - How many people do you usually entertain at one time?
 - What kind of activities – BBQ, games, mostly children, adults?
- Do you need a play area for children?
 - Playset, swings, trampoline, sandbox, lawn area?
- Do you travel during certain times of the year?
 - (Plant selection will be determined by when you are home the most)
- Are you considering a certain style of design?
 - For example: formal or informal?
 - Or: English garden, Japanese garden or Country style?
- Are you interested in a garden of special interest?
 - i.e. container garden, vegetable, perennial or rock garden?
- Are you interested in attracting birds, butterflies or other wildlife?
- Are there any disabled needs that should be addressed in the landscape?
- Are there background noises or views that you need to mask (highway or neighbors)?
- Are there any views or landmarks that you would like to accentuate?
- What are your favorite colors?
 - Do you like pastels or bold colors?
- Are there any plants you like or dislike?
- Are there any hardscape materials you like or dislike?
 - For example: Pavers, bluestone, masonry, brick, natural stone products.

Landscape projects can range in price from \$10,000 to over \$250,000. It’s important to know how you plan to invest in your property so we can design your landscape to fit your needs and stay within budget. We will discuss this with you during our consultation.
